| 5555 | Wall/Roof Panel<br>Ribbed        | Noticing same large discrepancies<br>with many of the other metal<br>wall/roof panels. We received a bid<br>for 26-gauge steel ribbed panel<br>roofing and it was higher. Please<br>review your pricing. | CoreLogic is reviewing and updating<br>the roof panel options as well as<br>corrugated roofing and wall/roof<br>panels. These updates will be available<br>in the November database update.  |
| 5558 | Drywall, 2' From<br>Floor, Taped | The specific line item is the Replace<br>Drywall Up to 2' from Floor – Taped.<br>CoreLogic is at \$3.39 and the<br>competitor is at \$6.86. Please<br>review the price.                                  | The item "Drywall Up to 2' From Floor,<br>Taped" assumes a contractor can<br>install just over 16' of drywall per hour<br>that has previously been cut out by a<br>contractor. This means that one 8'<br>sheet is cut in half and installed on a<br>wall in an hour. The competitor's price<br>only allows for 8' to be installed in that<br>same timeframe. CoreLogic will review<br>the productivity rate for this line item<br>and put into consideration that the<br>original flood cut was not straight<br>which would make it even more time<br>consuming to re-install the drywall. |

|    | oreL<br>566 | Gutters                  | The database has generic Gutter &<br>Cover pricing but it still falls short of<br>Leaf Guard pricing. Perhaps CL can<br>add pricing for miters and height<br>charges as well as review current<br>pricing.   | CoreLogic will review the current price<br>in the database for the Gutter & Cover<br>item. The quote included was very<br>helpful but the price quoted seems<br>high. Leaf guard is charging \$150/hr.<br>for labor along with a separate<br>mobilization fee of \$1375. Those rates<br>will not be included in the LF price of<br>the gutter system. The mobilization fee<br>can be added by selecting Mobilization<br>Fee under the FEE category. We will<br>review the pricing for the installation<br>cost and update it as necessary. Miters<br>are already included and there is a<br>separate line item for Height<br>Allowance-Gutters in the SFG-Gutters<br>category. |

| 55 | 571         | Abatement Sticky<br>Mats | I have a question regarding the line<br>item for "Floor Protection, Foot-<br>Adhesive Plastic Film". The Foot-<br>adhesive part is confusing as the<br>sticky pads used in abatement are<br>sticky on top to trap dust from the<br>feet of technicians. I'm assuming this<br>line item is not that, but plastic that<br>adheres to carpet. Can the foot-<br>adhesive part be changed to self-<br>stick or something like that? Can a<br>line item be added for abatement<br>sticky mats? | CoreLogic will update the description<br>to "Floor Protection, Self-Adhesive<br>Plastic Film". Also, we will add a<br>specific line item for an abatement<br>sticky mat for dust and dirt collection.  |

| 5573 | LOGIC <sup>®</sup><br>Ridge Shingles | Currently ridge shingles for fiberglass<br>laminate need high profile ridge<br>shingles. Need pricing updated for<br>the Designer, Excellent Grand Manor<br>ridge shingles which are higher<br>quality/cost vs standard ridge-<br>fiberglass-laminate. Also need<br>pricing updated for the Designer,<br>Excellent Grand Manor starter row<br>which is a specialty starter row.                                       | CoreLogic will review and update the<br>pricing for the Excellent Grade<br>Designer Laminate shingles. Currently<br>the price is an average of a few<br>different shingles from a few<br>manufacturers. We will also add a<br>special high-profile ridge shingle that<br>will be more expensive than the<br>current high-profile ridge cap item as<br>well as the specialized starter strip that<br>is installed with the Grand Manor<br>shingle.  |  |  |  |  |

| 5584 | Fence, Paint                         | Appears all the clean operations for<br>fence line items contain a descriptor<br>which is associated with the replace<br>operation for the fence.   | The replace operation item comment<br>is there by design. In the database, the<br>replace operation comment is the<br>default assigned to the item except<br>where it is just a generic clean or paint<br>operation which does not share an<br>item description with other operations.<br>These items will be changing as<br>CoreLogic starts consolidating clean<br>and paint operations throughout the<br>database to remove some of the<br>clutter in those specific categories.                        |  |  |  |  |
| 5580 | Thermal Imager                       | Symbility currently holds 2 different<br>line items related to thermal images.<br>The pricing is \$253.28 and I feel this<br>pricing is out of date. The reason<br>being is that technology has<br>improved and I can buy a FLIR<br>camera on amazon for \$499.00 and<br>have it at my house in 2 days. There<br>was a time where thermal imaging<br>was something worth \$253.28 but<br>that time has come and gone. | CoreLogic will review the current<br>Thermal Imager in the database and<br>add a Thermal Camera line item which<br>is cheaper and matches closer with the<br>item that was included with this<br>question. The current Thermal Imaging<br>item in the database is based more on<br>the Flir E40 and E60 models which see<br>deep into a wall instead of a camera<br>version which can just show heat<br>signatures on the surface.
